again by reading to them, but some learn to read at
an early age, so provide books with historical facts
and/or illustrations according to their age. Teach
our youth our Pledge to the Flag, our National
Anthem and about other areas of historical
significance.

Library

How can you promote patriotism through literacy? Through libraries: community libraries, school libraries, classroom libraries and home libraries. Donations of appropriate age level books depicting our history of patriotism is how you can support these libraries. In my program I have listed several age-appropriate books that can be purchased and donated to a library of your choosing, but the list is endless.

Literacy benefits

Literacy benefits are numerous also. For example, books teach our youth our American history; they foster a love for reading thus providing a lifetime of learning; books help our youth to better understand our American history; and books improve

grammar, writing skills, and concentration just to mention a few.

Participation

How can you participate? Volunteer at your local library; donate historical books to local schools and community libraries; donate books to local shelters temporarily housing youth at risk; host a read-a-thon at a school awarding prizes for the most books read. Youth love awards, and we have a great Award, our own

Have you observed youth showing patriotism? Have you seen a child thanking a veteran? Have you witnessed a child or youth place their hand over their heart correctly? Have you seen a child or

Other areas of working with our youth:

Create, Support and Work with Youth Groups - HOW?

Through Community involvement - Boys and Girls Clubs of America; Scouts; School-sponsored clubs; church groups. Also, youth groups can assist with our auxiliary projects - help to deliver groceries to disabled veterans; helping veterans with yard work or taking out trash for them; visiting nursing homes, hospitals or veterans' centers. Our veterans and our elderly love for our youth to visit them.

Recognizing our youth with the Get Excited for the Red, White and Blue! singing contest is another area for our youth to excel. Two age groups, K-8 and 9-12. The contest is singing our National Anthem in any genre without changing the words.
